When can I get a book?


The library will be open before school from 7:45-8:15. Teachers will also have two library passes for REACH.

How long can I keep a book?


The checkout period is two weeks but you can renew the book twice unless there is a wait list

- 4. Copy/Paste recommendation into DESTINY catalog review form
- 5. Complete online T.R.A.C.K.ing form to be eligible for PRIZES
- 6. T.R.A.C.K. your reading on your TEAM NUTMEG card
- 7. Earn incentives at 4, 8 and 12 books
