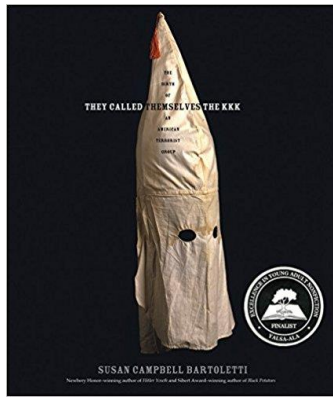

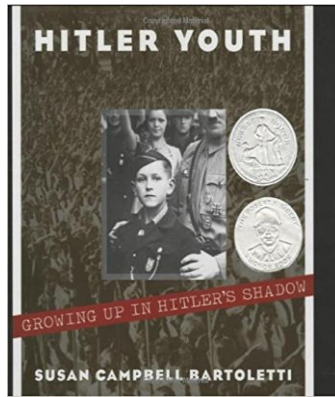

Ms. Bartoletti's Bio:

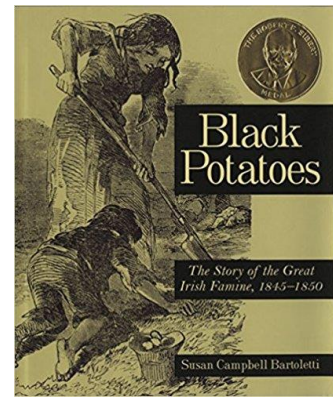
Susan Campbell Bartoletti is the author of picture books, novels, and nonfiction for children, including the Newbery Honor book *Hitler Youth: Growing Up in Hitler's Shadow*, the Sibert Medal-winning *Black Potatoes*, and *Dear America: A Coal Miner's Bride*. Her work has received dozens of awards and honors, including the NCTE Orbis Pictus Award for Nonfiction, the SCBWI Golden Kite Award for Nonfiction, and the Jane Addams Children's Book Award. With her most recent novel, *The Boy Who Dared*, Susan has taken one episode from *Hitler Youth*, and fleshed it out into thought-provoking novel. It is based on the true story of Helmuth Hübener, a heroic German youth who dared to stand up against the Nazis. While conducting research for *Hitler Youth*, she interviewed Karl-Heinz Schnibbe, the only survivor of the Helmuth Hübener Resistance group. Susan Campbell Bartoletti lives with her family in Moscow, Pennsylvania.



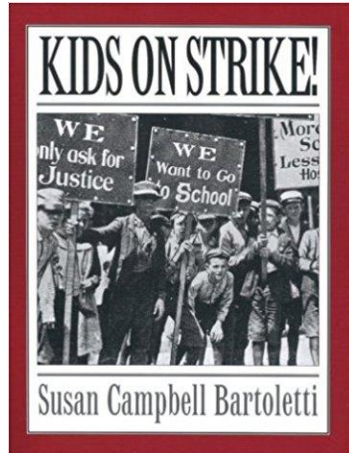

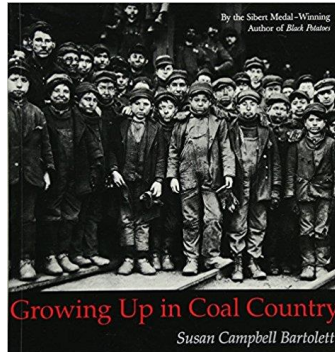

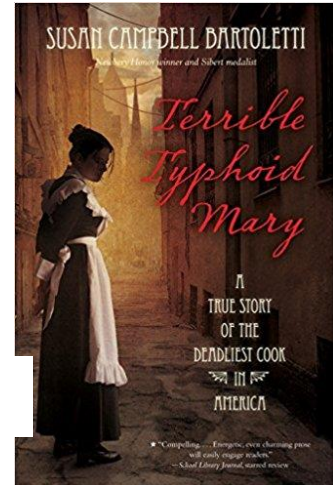
