This course aims to provide students with the necessary skills to critically analyze and evaluate media messages. Students will explore how media shapes our beliefs, values, and attitudes and learn how to become informed and responsible media consumers.

  - Print media (journalism and its impact on society)

- Define information literacy and its importance in the digital age
- Understanding and evaluating Information Sources (credibility, bias, relevance, etc.)
- Recognizing misinformation, bias, hoaxes
- Paraphrasing and avoiding plagiarism

- Analyzing media messages

- Online Safety and Privacy
  - Protecting personal information online
  - Disinhibition / cyberbullying
